Please place your order by 9:30am the day before the feed is required for out of area orders, and the day before for local orders to help us have the feed delivered when you require it.



There is a 20 bag or a half tonne minimum for bagged custom feeds and premixes, and a one tonne minimum for bulk feeds. Please keep this in mind when you call.

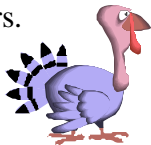


Please label your bins to reduce the risk of an error when feed is delivered. Bin labels are available from Jones Feed Mills.

However, if the roads or visibility are too bad, our drivers will be instructed to wait for better conditions before delivering the remainder of their load. Please order your feed in advance so that you have a better chance of it being delivered when it's needed, and keep your laneways and yards clean.

## Booking Prices

Booking prices are available for feed until April 30. Please contact your sales rep or the mill for a price. Markets are extremely volatile, and therefore booking prices can change without notice. A booking price quoted today may not be available tomorrow. Booking prices are based on the availability of buying ingredients in the future to cover the booking, and as the market changes the commodity ingredient prices will change also. When booking feed, we need to know the tonnage you expect to use for 6 months.

## Improved Hog Outlook in 2009



A decrease in feed prices combined with large cuts in North American hog production is pointing towards higher profits for hog farmers in 2009. According to Informa Economics vice president, there will be increasing stability in hog markets from contracts made in the past 12 months. It could take six to nine months for markets to reflect this, but times are promising.

## Corn Toxins



Toxins have been found in corn and corn silage this year. Toxin is a form of poison, and has adverse effects on animal health and reproduction. There are options available if toxins are found in your corn. If you suspect toxins, or would like to learn about feed options to combat them, please contact your sales representative.

Jones is testing corn coming into the mill for toxin levels, and rejecting loads over the toxin threshold. Between maintaining a low toxin level at the mill and working together with our customers who have grain on the farm from other sources, we hope to minimize the risk of toxin poisoning.

## Barley and Mixed Grain Needed



Jones is looking to buy barley and mixed grain. If you have some available, please contact Brad at the Linwood mill Monday to Friday, 7am to noon. If you would like to sell mixed grain and buy corn back at a profit, that is also possible.
